Reflections from the Mass of Thanksgiving Monsignor Downey Council # 3660 Knights of Columbus December 12, 2016

If these walls could talk! Think of the stories that they would tell of the events that have taken place in this Council Hall through the years. In a very real sense these walls *can* talk because all of the good that has been undertaken by the Knights of Columbus in this place is forever known to God.

An old adage says, "We build the buildings and then the buildings build us." How true that is of this venerable Council Hall. For decades this building has formed Christian gentlemen and men of the Church and we come together this evening to thank God for all that has taken place here.

Our first reading for this evening's Mass was taken from the Old Testament Book of Ecclesiastes. We are told that there is a time for every purpose under heaven. There was once a time to build this building and now is a time to leave it. But before we do leave this Council Hall, it is right for us to come together to thank God for the faith that has been shared, the friendships that have been fostered and the good that has been undertaken here. We are grateful for the Knights who have gone before us and on whose shoulders we stand. We offer this Mass for the repose of the souls of all of the deceased members of Council 3660.
