DID YOU KNOW:

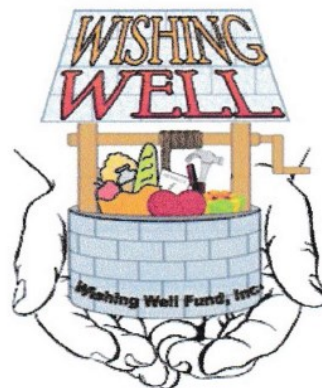
- ◇ We help over 150 families each year with food for Christmas.

Thanks again for your hard work and leadership! I felt happy to meet your bride at the Officer David Moore Food Pantry recently.

You asked me to send you some of the things we discussed. Because most of our volunteers are older ladies, we are not currently open to the public. However, throughout the pandemic we have assisted other organizations with food, including the Garden Door ministry at Saint John the Evangelist Church (my parish) downtown and the food pantry at the Hoosier Veterans Assistance Foundation. Our most recent project is sending food home for the weekend with students from Holy Cross, Central Catholic, and Saint Philip Neri Schools. Although they receive good meals at school during the week, school children often have too little to eat on weekends.

Your Council's gifts help us immensely, especially food that kids like, including peanut butter and jelly, canned pasta dishes, canned fruit, and canned vegetables. Soups are also popular, because it's easy to add other things to them to create a meal. Canned tuna and chicken are particularly popular for similar reasons, as they are easy to add to other foods. We always have strong demand for macaroni and cheese and for dry boxes of pasta with sauce in cans or jars. We hope to send home foods that kids and their families will enjoy, although we work hard to ensure the food we give is nutritious.

Please thank our brother Knights on my behalf and on behalf of the people we serve. May God continue to bless you in your love and compassion for His people!
